Course Descriptions

Domestic Abuse Education

DV 101 - Dynamics of Domestic Abuse

30-60 minutes

This training explores the definitions of domestic and dating abuse, cycle of abuse, power and control wheel, barriers to leaving abusive relationships, impact of abuse, and a look at why the first 90 days after separation are the most dangerous time for a victim's safety.

DV 102 - Recognizing, Responding, and Referring

30-45 minutes

This training explores communicating with service providers and alleged or suspected victims of abuse and discusses local resources. If the audience goes into the home of potential or known victims, this training may also include safety considerations. A discussion of confidentiality laws and rights of service providers and victims may also be included. Training focuses on the importance of Working Together- a Collaborated Community Response between you, your agency, and Turning Point.

DV 103 – Impact of Domestic Abuse on Children

45-60 minutes

This training looks at the short and long-term impact of domestic abuse on children and the ways in which we can all act as protective factors for these vulnerable children. Additional discussion may include approaching youth about the subject, internal resilience, and developmental assets that can be identified and enhanced with youth in all settings.

DV 104- Domestic Abuse in Underserved Populations

30-60 minutes

This training identifies some of the barriers faced by victims of domestic abuse who live in rural areas, are elderly, undocumented, non-native English speakers, or identify as LGBTQ+ and the resources available to them.

DV 105 – Domestic Abuse Laws for Service Providers

30-120 minutes

This training provides an overview of civil and criminal laws that impact victims of domestic abuse and their children. We will create this training specific to the laws most often seen for your profession and role with victims and children. Legal issues discussed may include, Orders of Protection, Paternity Affidavits and Rights of Unmarried Parents, Domestic Battery, including child-related enhancements, Animal Abuse, and Legal Resources.

DV 106 – Bystander Intervention

60-90 minutes

Have you ever suspected that someone is in an unhealthy or abusive relationship? Do you know abuse when you see it? Do you know what to do? Are you comfortable intervening? Please join us to discuss the dynamics of domestic and dating abuse; how to recognize potentially abusive or harmful situations; the 3 Ds of bystander intervention- Direct, Distract, and Delegate; and how to respond while remaining safe. This training will be adapted to speak directly to each profession and setting where you may encounter abuse on the job and in the community.

DV 107—Disclosures & Mandatory Reporting

60 minutes

Do you know what child and endangered adult abuse and neglect look like? Do you know when, where, and how to report suspected abuse, neglect, or human trafficking? Are you comfortable handling disclosures in a variety of settings? Are you familiar with the boundaries between confidentiality and mandated reporting? This training will familiarize you with those topics, with a specific eye to the types of disclosures and reports you may be exposed to in your role.

DV 108—Healthy Relationships & Intimate Partner Violence in LGBTQIA+ Communities

60 minutes

This training explores healthy relationships, the importance of knowing the signs of Intimate Partner Violence (IPV), how IPV presents in LGBTQIA+ relationships, why LGBTQIA+ survivors do not leave abusive relationships, and how to seek or offer help. Additional discussion topics include the impact of abuse on survivors, with a special emphasis on the impact of abuse in the LGBTQIA+ Community.

DV 109—Preventing Dating Abuse: Teaching Children & Youth About Healthy Relationships

60-90 minutes

This training is designed to help parents and caretakers of teens and future-teens better understand how to talk to youth in their lives about healthy relationships. We will discuss the types of abuse often seen in unhealthy dating relationships and how to recognize and respond when abuse is observed. Attendees will also receive tips for reinforcing healthy relationship traits for youth of all ages. Other topics may include the impact of abuse on relationships and the indicators of teen dating abuse, as well as a look at resiliency and protective factors.

DV 110—Tap that App

60-90 minutes

Have you ever wondered what kids are doing on their phones and computers? This is your chance to get a closer look. We will delve into the world of technology and its impact on relationships. Learn what youth are using daily, discover ways to stay in the loop, and explore the impact that smart phones, social media, and sexting are having on personal interactions. Expand your knowledge of technology safety and learn about the related laws. Bring your smartphones and get ready to play!

DV 111—Working with Teen Survivors of Sexual Assault

45-90 minutes

Do you know the legal and real-life definitions of sexual assault, how to recognize signs of sexual assault in teens, and how to discuss sexual assault with youth? Join us to discuss these matters as well as statistics, risk factors, impact, resiliency, consent, and more. Additional topics may include programming recommendations, rights of the survivor, mandatory reporting, boundaries for service providers, and tips for building trust.

TP 101 - Turning Point Services

15-60 minutes

This training is designed to educate participants about Turning Point's services, including Residential, Non-Residential, Prevention, Education, and Training Programs. This training is typically paired with DV 101 and at least one other substantive and audience-specific topic.

Law Enforcement-Specific Topics

Law Enforcement trainings pair well with TP 101 and all DV topics

LE 101 - Law Enforcement Response to Crimes of Domestic Abuse

45-60 minutes

This training discusses best practices for law enforcement's approach to an alleged crime of domestic abuse. It specifically focuses on working with victims, survivors, and children in order to help them feel more comfortable communicating with law enforcement; duties placed on law enforcement officers to "prevent future violence"; when to remove weapons; notice of victim rights; and efforts to be taken to keep officers, victims, accused, children, and witnesses safe. A discussion of federal firearm rules as related to Orders of Protection or Domestic Battery conviction may also be included.

LE 102 - On Scene Investigation and Report Writing

60-90 minutes

This course discusses best practices for investigating domestic abuse cases, considering the possibility that the victim will be unavailable as a witness by the time of trial. It focuses on interview techniques; documentation and photography of evidence; and top strategies for report writing.

LE 103 - Investigating Strangulation Cases

45-90 minutes

Strangulation is one of the most common crimes committed against domestic abuse victims. Historically, it has been difficult to prove in the criminal justice system because there frequently are no visible signs of harm, even though there may be significant internal injuries. This training focuses on how to spot possible internal injuries that are not visible at the scene and suggest that all strangulation and suffocation victims receive medical attention. It outlines less obvious signs and symptoms of strangulation, questions an officer can ask to detect strangulation, and follow-up to assist in building a felony case against the accused.

LE 104 - Stalking and Cyber Stalking

45-60 minutes

This training defines the crime of stalking, provide profiles of different kinds of stalkers, and discuss strategies for putting together a strong case. Training also includes working with the victim on safety planning, documenting future incidents, counter-surveillance, methods of technological spying by batterers through Spyware, GPS tracking devices, and cell phones. We can also discuss cyber-bullying and non-consensual pornography (aka- revenge porn).



LE 105 - Determining Self-Defense and Primary Aggressor ***45-60 minutes***

This training includes a discussion on Indiana's law on self-defense, defensive vs. offensive injuries, evidence, and how to assess for primary aggressor. Video scenarios can be used to help officers determine who, if anyone, to arrest when there are visible injuries to both or neither person. This training will examine the impact arrest can have on batterer recidivism, likelihood of victim's seeking help in the future, the safety of the family and the community at large. It looks at elements of probable cause and why dual arrests should be avoided in domestic abuse cases.

LE 106 - Orders of Protection ***60 minutes***

This training covers the different types of Orders of Protection, both civil and criminal, eligibility requirements, service, Full Faith and Credit, and enforcement of local and "foreign" Orders, including enforcement of parenting time matters addressed in the Order and law enforcement response to alleged violations.

LE 107 - Legislative Update ***30-90 minutes***

Find out what domestic abuse, sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking, and family-related laws are taking effect July 1 each year so you can be ready, or discuss the recent changes in the law, and how they are impacting law enforcement and victims.

LE 108 - Dispatcher Duties ***60-90 minutes***

This training focuses on the role of the 911 dispatcher as the first contact during or after a domestic abuse incident. We discuss the role as an "ear witness"; safety of the parties, children, and officers; lethality assessments; probable cause; and specific questions to ask to increase safety and to assist with successful prosecution.

Continuing Legal Education for Attorneys

Attorney trainings pair well with TP 101 and all DV topics

CLE 101 - Ethical Considerations for Civil Attorneys in DV Cases ***60-90 minutes***

This training includes a discussion on best practices for working with domestic abuse victims, with a focus on Indiana's Rules of Professional Conduct as they relate to handling cases involving domestic abuse.

CLE 102 - Orders of Protection ***60 minutes***

This training involves a full discussion on Civil Protective Orders and Criminal No Contact Orders for adults and minors, including the grounds, eligibility, relief, violations, enforcement, and effectiveness of such Orders.

CLE 103 - Domestic Abuse and Family Law ***60-90 minutes***

This training provides a thorough discussion of the specific areas in a family law case where domestic abuse may come into play. This includes a discussion on the Best Interest of the Child



standard, Indiana Parenting Time Guidelines, Supervised Parenting Time, Parallel Parenting Plans, Crimes Impacting Custody and Parenting Time, Mediation, and Relocation.

CLE 104 - Domestic Abuse and the Practice of Law ***60-90 minutes***

This training provides an overview of the impact domestic abuse can have on the practice of law, no matter the attorney's focus area. Included is a discussion on assessing for abuse and trauma, a description of how your clients may be victimized in their intimate partner relationship and, what you can do if a client discloses that they have been abused. Additional topics may include available victim services and resources, discrimination, housing, employment, and immigration matters.

Domestic Abuse and Health Care

All Health Care Topics pair well with TP 101 and all DV topics

HC 101 – Recognizing Domestic Abuse in the Healthcare Setting ***45-60 minutes***

This training is designed to assist healthcare providers screen for domestic abuse as part of routine intake and assessments of medical needs. Topics may include interview styles, effective universal and specific questions, long-term health complaints and symptoms of abuse survivors, strangulation and documentation of complaints and concerns.

HC 102 - Healthcare and Domestic Abuse for OBGYNs ***45 minutes***

This training is designed for OB/GYN, emergency room and other healthcare providers who work with pregnant women or new mothers. Included will be a discussion on assessing for domestic abuse, abuse during pregnancy, health complaints and symptoms of domestic abuse survivors. We will also provide an overview of Paternity laws and Paternity Affidavits.

HC 103 - Domestic Abuse and EMT Response ***60-90 minutes***

This training is designed for Emergency Medical Technicians. Topics may include assessing for domestic abuse, on-scene safety, long-term health complaints and symptoms of domestic abuse survivors, strangulation, appropriate and effective responses to victims of domestic abuse, importance of documentation.

Workplace Violence Prevention- Domestic Abuse in the Workplace

All Workplace trainings pair well with TP 101 and DV 101-108

WPVP 101 - Policy Writing

We will meet with you, your leadership team, board members and/or attorneys to assist you in creating an effective policy regarding domestic abuse prevention in the workplace. We will help draft a policy that works best based on the size and locations of your company, and your company's goals and resources. We can help you integrate this into your current policies or we



can start fresh. The focus of this discussion and collaboration is on business costs, liability risks, employee safety, and developing effective internal policies and protocols.

WPVP 102 - Management and Human Resources Training

This single targeted training focuses on identifying domestic abuse in staff, knowing what to say when an employee reveals personal information, how to confidentially handle potential security risks and refer an employee to local EAP and domestic abuse service provider.

WPVP 103 - Employee Training

This training focuses on definitions of domestic abuse, cycle of abuse, impact of domestic abuse on personal health, internal procedures for reporting potentially dangerous situations, non-retaliation policies, and internal and community resources for assistance.
